Acknowledgement of Country

From time immemorial the Wurundjeri people have cared for this land, nurtured it, depended on it and given honour and thanks to the Creator.

Isaiah 60:1;

Collect: Lord God of the nations, we have seen the star of your glory rising in splendour; may the brightness of your incarnate Word, pierce the night that covers the earth, signal the dawn of justice and peace, and beckon all nations to walk as one in your light. We ask this through Jesus Christ, your Word made flesh, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, in the splendour of eternal light, God for ever and ever. **Amen.**

Readings

The first reading is from the Book of the Prophet Isaiah 60:1-6;

Arise, shine; for your light has come, and the glory of the LORD has risen upon you. For darkness shall cover the earth, and thick darkness the peoples; but the LORD will arise upon you, and his glory will appear over you. Nations shall come to your light, and kings to the brightness of your dawn. Lift up your eyes and look around; they all gather together, they come to you; your sons shall come from far away, and your daughters shall be carried on their nurses' arms. Then you shall see and be radiant; your heart shall thrill and rejoice, because the abundance of the sea shall be brought to you, the wealth of the nations shall come to you. A multitude of camels shall cover you, the young camels of Midian and Ephah; all those from Sheba shall come. They shall bring gold and frankincense, and shall proclaim the praise of the LORD.

Hear the Word of the Lord Thanks be to God

Psalms 72:1-7, 10-14 said by alternate half verse

¹ Give the king your judgement, O God,
and your righteousness to the son of a king.

² That he may judge your people rightly;
and the poor of the land with equity.

³ Let the mountains be laden with peace, because of his righteousness
and the hills also with prosperity for his people.

⁴ May he give justice to the poor among the people,
**and rescue the children of the needy,
and crush the oppressor.**

⁵ May he live while the sun endures;
and while the moon gives light, throughout all generations.

⁶ May he come down like rain upon the new-mown fields;
and as showers that water the earth.

⁷ In his time shall righteousness flourish
and abundance of peace, till the moon shall be no more.

The second reading is from the letter of Paul to the Ephesians 3:1-12;

This is the reason that I Paul am a prisoner for Christ Jesus for the sake of you Gentiles for surely you have already heard of the commission of God's grace that was given to me for you, and how the mystery was made known to me by revelation, as I wrote above in a few words, a reading of which will enable you to perceive my understanding of the mystery of Christ. In former generations this mystery was not made known to humankind, as it has now been revealed to his holy apostles and prophets by the Spirit: that is, the Gentiles have become fellow-heirs, members of the same body, and sharers in the promise in Christ Jesus through the gospel. Of this gospel I have become a servant according to the gift of God's grace that was given to me by the working of his power. Although I am the very least of all the saints, this grace was given to me to bring to the Gentiles the news of the boundless riches of Christ, and to make everyone see what is the plan of the mystery hidden for ages in God who created all things; so that through the church the wisdom of God in its rich variety might now be made known to the rulers and authorities in the heavenly places. This was in accordance with the eternal purpose that he has carried out in Christ Jesus our Lord, in whom we have access to God in boldness and confidence through faith in him.*

The Lord be with you; and also with you

The Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Matthew 2. 1-12: Glory to you Lord Jesus Christ

In the time of King Herod, after Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judea, wise men from the East came to Jerusalem, asking, 'Where is the child who has been born king of the Jews? For we observed his star at its rising, and have come to pay him homage.' When King Herod heard this, he was frightened, and all Jerusalem with him; and calling together all the chief priests and scribes of the people, he inquired of them where the Messiah was to be born. They told him, 'In Bethlehem of Judea; for so it has been written by the prophet: "And you, Bethlehem, in the land of Judah, are by no means least among the rulers of Judah; for from you shall come a ruler who is to shepherd my people Israel." Then Herod secretly called for the wise men and learned from them the exact time when the star had appeared. Then he sent them to Bethlehem, saying, 'Go and search diligently for the child; and when you have found him, bring me word so that I may also go and pay him homage.' When they had heard the king, they set out; and there, ahead of them, went the star that they had seen at its rising, until it stopped over the place where the child was. When they saw that the star had stopped, they were overwhelmed with joy. On entering the house, they saw the child with Mary his mother; and they knelt down and paid him homage. Then, opening their treasure-chests, they offered him gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh. And having been warned in a dream not to return to Herod, they left for their own country by another road.

This is the Gospel of the Lord Praise to you Lord Jesus Christ

Faith Matters: Jesus convicts us in many ways.

Epiphany is a season where we look for those moments that help us understand that Jesus is our Saviour. In the Matthew 1 we see the detailed genealogy of Jesus showing he is clearly from the House of David. Matthew recognises Jesus as the Messiah through Jewish traditions and prophecies and announces it to the world. In the reading from the gospel today, Matthew shares that Jesus is revealed as the redeemer of the world to others using their traditions and spirituality. There are many ways that Jesus reveals himself as the redeemer of the world.

Today's passage reminds us that people we speak to already have a spirituality and a way to relate to God. Our role in releasing the kingdom is not to impose ourselves on people, but to help people understand that their spiritual journey, like the Magi, are fulfilled in Jesus by listening and helping people have an epiphany on how it all fits together in the Lord.

Epiphany House Blessing. There is a tradition in which we bless our house each and every year on the day of the Epiphany of the Lord. Using the chalk that has been blessed, note the following above your door: 20+C+M+B+24 (C, M, B can represent the traditional names of the wise men as well as abbreviating the Latin phrase, Christus mansionem benedicat: "May Christ bless the house.") After completing the above markings, the following prayer to be said at the door:
May all who come to our home this year rejoice to find Christ living among us; and may we seek and serve, in everyone we meet, that same Jesus who is Lord of all people forever and ever. Amen.
