## Readings

The first reading is from the Book of Jonah 3. 1-10;

The word of the LORD came to Jonah, saying, 'Get up, go to Nineveh, that great city, and proclaim to it the message that I tell you.' So Jonah set out and went to Nineveh, according to the word of the LORD. Now Nineveh was an exceedingly large city, a three days' walk across. Jonah began to go into the city, going a day's walk. And he cried out, 'Forty days more, and Nineveh shall be overthrown!' And the people of Nineveh believed God; they proclaimed a fast, and everyone, great and small, put on sackcloth. When the news reached the king of Ninevah, he rose from his throne, removed his robe, covered himself with sackcloth, and sat in ashes. Then he had a proclamation made in Ninevah: "By the decree of the king and his nobles: No human being or animal, no herd or flock, shall taste anything. They shall not feed, nor shall they drink water. Human beings and animals shall be covered with sackcloth, and they shall cry mightily to God. All shall turn from their evil ways and from the violence that is in their hands. Who knows? God may relent and change his mind; he may turn from his fierce anger, so that we do not perish. When God saw what they did, how they turned from their evil ways, God changed his mind about the calamity that he had said he would bring upon them; and he did not do it

# The Lord be with you; and also with you

The Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Mark 1:14-20; Glory to you Lord Jesus Christ After John was arrested, Jesus came to Galilee, proclaiming the good news of God, and saying, 'The time is fulfilled, and the kingdom of God has come near; repent, and believe in the good news.' As Jesus passed along the Sea of Galilee, he saw Simon and his brother Andrew casting a net into the lake – for they were fishermen. And Jesus said to them, 'Follow me and I will make you fish for people.' And immediately they left their nets and followed him. As he went a little farther, he saw James son of Zebedee and his brother John, who were in their boat mending the nets. Immediately he called them; and they left their father Zebedee in the boat with the hired men, and followed him.

Faith Matters: "No worries" is perhaps the most loved Aussi expression. I love it and like it really. It can relieve you of your anxiety for the moment. It can also then be a way of life if you can wield confidence to wade through the difficult waters of life. However, realistically speaking, for many of us life is not that simple always. Worries surround us all the more as we grow: work, money, rent, mortgage, house utility bills, etc. etc. We are always worried for some reason or the other. Today's readings offer us a great respite, The collect of the day affirms that we are called by Jesus, the Son of God, to repent of our Sin, to believe the good news and celebrate the coming of God's Kingdom, we pray to be taught like His own apostles, to hear the call to discipleship, to forsake old ways and to proclaim the Gospel of new life. This echoes the Gospel passage in which we learn Jesus himself: announces that the Kingdom of God is at hand, and invites people to repent and believe in the good news. It clearly indicates if we follow in this simple programmatic direction we will be enjoying life to its hilt. The Only precondition is a complete turning around, trusting in God and His faithfulness towards us. Jesus calls Simon and Andrew. They were working, fending for their livelihood. Yet, they simply followed him leaving their nets. And so did James and John who left their boat with their father and hired men. They stepped outside of their comfort zone from under the guidance and care of their father and their already built in support system of their fishing business enterprise. How could all this be? What was it in the call of Jesus that they found it so compelling to leave everything and follow him? In the coming of Jesus, as St. Paul mentions the appointed time had already come. Ney, the appointed time had grown short, he says, meaning the time contracted into itself. An event that was to happen sometimes far off in the future had already come. Paul in his same later farther in chapter 15:20 affirms, that 'Christ is the first fruit of those who have died'. Further Paul clearly suggests, 'those who are in Christ... for as all die in Adam, so all will be made alive in Christ' (15:22). Then he conforms that 'all this will take place at the coming of Christ (15;23). It is this event of the coming of the Lord is in Pauls mind that he encourages the Corinthians to know that 'the appointed time has grown short; ...the present form of this world is passing away'. So Paul encourages us to build up the kind of attitude as though the coming of Christ is imminent. When the world is after Power, money, comfort and after pseudo pursuits of peace in times of war and in a culture of self aggrandisement for profit, we are called by Jesus to follow an alternative path of justice, equality, peace and rest, where relationships will flourish and joy will abound in the world. Are we willing to respond to the call then? As Simon and Andrew, James and John did. Can we follow in the footsteps of the Apostles and be taught by Jesus, as we are praying in the collect, to build an alternative world view and culture that will truly sustain and offer peaceable life for all in this world?

Let us ponder, pray and practice with God's help. Amen. Every blessing. Rev. Prashant.
