

The Second Reading is from the letter of Paul to the Romans ch. 1. v. 1–7;

Paul, a servant of Jesus Christ, called to be an apostle, set apart for the gospel of God, which he promised beforehand through his prophets in the holy scriptures, the gospel concerning his Son, who was descended from David according to the flesh and was declared to be Son of God with power according to the spirit of holiness by resurrection from the dead, Jesus Christ our Lord. Through Christ we have received grace and apostleship to bring about the obedience of faith among all the Gentiles for the sake of his name, including yourselves who are called to belong to Jesus Christ, To all God's beloved in Rome, who are called to be saints: Grace to you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ.

Hear the Word of the Lord; Thanks be to God

The Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Matthew 1:18–25; Glory to you Lord Jesus Christ

The birth of Jesus the Messiah took place in this way. When his mother Mary had been engaged to Joseph, but before they lived together, she was found to be with child from the Holy Spirit. Her husband Joseph, being a righteous man and unwilling to expose her to public disgrace, planned to dismiss her quietly. But just when he had resolved to do this, an angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream and said, 'Joseph, son of David, do not be afraid to take Mary as your wife, for the child conceived in her is from the Holy Spirit. She will bear a son, and you are to name him Jesus, for he will save his people from their sins.' All this took place to fulfil what had been spoken by the Lord through the prophet: 'Look, the virgin shall conceive and bear a son, and they shall name him Emmanuel,' which means, 'God is with us.' When Joseph awoke from sleep, he did as the angel of the Lord commanded him; he took her as his wife, but had no marital relations with her until she had borne a son; and he named him Jesus.

This is the Gospel of the Lord; Praise to you Lord Jesus Christ

Faith Matters!! - Love

Joseph being a righteous man was unwilling to expose Mary to public disgrace which would have most certainly led to her death but was going to dismiss her quietly and move on with his life. This was the case until the angel of the Lord came to Joseph and spoke to him in a vision which restored his connection to God's plan and allowed him to move forward with Mary and preserve his righteousness. In today's passage we see love acting in two ways with Joseph.

Firstly, he clearly loved Mary and wanted no harm to come to her. If he wanted to follow his honour the Law of the Torah allowed for Mary to be stoned and beaten for "sinful" actions. It is interesting that Joseph just wanted to be a righteous man, and in following this path, he went down a another road—that which allowed his to do to Mary as he would want done to him. He showed mercy.

Secondly, we see another love, which is the advent love that we profess today. Advent love is the love that comes from hope, peace and joy in the Lord. In Jesus' words, Joseph loves his god with all his heart, mind, soul and strength. When filled with the hope that Jesus is the Messiah, the knowledge that Jesus is the king of peace and that the world will be filled with joy when all people are saved and restored to God—he comes to be filled with the love of God.

When we are filled with the love of our God, how much more can we love our neighbour. In Joseph's case, how much more could he love Mary and care for her as the love of God gave him the power of heaven to do so.

This week we light the candle of love. Allow your love light to be empowered by hope, peace and joy that finds its source in God so that your thoughts, word and deeds can be empowered by heaven. Live in the knowledge that your ministry and discipleship, like Joseph's, is part of God's plan.
