When I bring clouds over the earth and the bow is seen in the clouds, I will remember my covenant that is between me and you and every living creature of all flesh; and the waters shall never again become a flood to destroy all flesh. When the bow is in the clouds, I will see it and remember the everlasting covenant between God and every living creature of all flesh that is on the earth.' God said to Noah, 'This is the sign of the covenant that I have established between me and all flesh that is on the earth.'

Christ also suffered for sins once for all, the righteous for the unrighteous, in order to bring you to God. He was put to death in the flesh, but made alive in the spirit, in which also he went and made a proclamation to the spirits in prison, who in former times did not obey, when God waited patiently in the days of Noah, during the building of the ark, in which a few, that is, eight persons, were saved through water. And baptism, which this prefigured, now saves you – not as a removal of dirt from the body, but as an appeal to God for a good conscience, through the resurrection of Jesus Christ, who has gone into heaven and is at the right hand of God, with angels, authorities, and powers made subject to him.

GOSPEL Mark 1.9–15

In those days Jesus came from Nazareth of Galilee and was baptized by John in the Jordan. And just as he was coming up out of the water, he saw the heavens torn apart and the Spirit descending like a dove on him. And a voice came from heaven, 'You are my Son, the Beloved; with you I am well pleased.' And the Spirit immediately drove him out into the wilderness. He was in the wilderness forty days, tempted by Satan; and he was with the wild beasts; and the angels waited on him. Now after John was arrested, Jesus came to Galilee, proclaiming the good news of God, and saying, 'The time is fulfilled, and the kingdom of God has come near; repent, and believe in the good news.'

ANGLICAN OVERSEAS AID - LENTEN REFLECTIONS Colours of Lent

Ash Wednesday marks the beginning of Lent. The colour grey is the colour of ashes, and in many Christian traditions ashes are imposed on the forehead as a sign of penitence.

In the Bible there are many references to the wearing of sackcloth and ashes as a mark of repentance. Ashes are also a sign of our own mortality. As the classic funeral liturgy goes, 'ashes to ashes, dust to dust'

For most people, grey is a gloomy colour redolent of melancholy and mourning. It reminds us of the storm clouds that gather. But grey is also the wisdom of experience, a crown of splendour (Proverbs 16. 31) And that wisdom surely knows that the clouds will pass.

In a passage closely associated with Jesus, the prophet Idaiah speaks of one who is anointed to comfort those who mourn.

He will bestow on them a crown of beauty instead of ashes, the oil of joy instead of mourning, and a garment of praise instead of a spirit of despair (Isaiah 61.3) While it is important that we should have a realistic view of our own failings, we can also know with certainty that our God is merciful.
