You shall eat your fill and bless the LORD your God for the good land that he has given you. The second reading is from the letter to the Hebrews 11. 8-16;

By faith Abraham obeyed when he was called to set out for a place that he was to receive as an inheritance; and he set out, not knowing where he was going. By faith he stayed for a time in the land he had been promised, as in a foreign land, living in tents, as did Isaac and Jacob, who were heirs with him of the same promise. For he looked forward to the city that has foundations, whose architect and builder is God. By faith he received power of procreation, even though he was too old—and

Sarah herself was barren—because he considered him faithful who had promised. Therefore from one person and this one as good as dead, descendants were born, 'as many as the stars of heaven and as the innumerable grains of sand by the seashore.' All of these died in faith without having received the promises, but from a distance they saw and greeted them. They confessed that they were strangers and foreigners on the earth, for people who speak in this way make it clear that they are seeking a homeland. If they had been thinking of the land that they had left behind, they would have had opportunity to return. But as it is, they desire a better country, that is, a heavenly one. Therefore God is not ashamed to be called their God; indeed, he has prepared a city for them.

Faith Matters!! Australia Day reflection

Jesus begins his sermon on the mount with words that were as counter cultural then as they are now. We have a perception on how we are blessed, but the way we see that we are blessed might be very different to how Jesus sees our blessings. We are blessed when we are humble and lowly: deeply convince that we will break relationships with God and those around us and need God to help us. We are blessed we mourn because we see our short comings and the effect on others. We are blessed when we are meek, being patient and content in our spirit, not bearing resentment towards God or others because of where things are at, but waiting for the good things which come in God's own timing. We are blessed when we hunger and thirst for righteousness and seek our mind to be conformed to see things in the way God would see them. We are blessed when we show merciful compassion to those that are suffering from sin or sorrow, and make it an intentional action to desire to make the sufferings of those around them less. We are blessed when our hearts are pure and do not merely aim to have an outward appearance of righteousness but who strive for an inward holiness. Blessed are the peacemakers who use their influence to promote peace and charity in both private and public. Blessed are those who are persecuted for righteousness sake and laughed at, mocked, despised and persecuted for following the way of Christ, because great is the reward for confessing Christ and being Christ-like before God the Father, angels and other people.

The very characteristics that the Lord praises are the very ones that the world despises. Pride, thought-lessness, anger, worldliness, selfishness, unlovingness which are found thriving in many places. Earlier this week we had Australia Day and there are many views that are brought up, not least that there are those in our community who mourn sinful actions that dispossessed them from their land, a land that was never ceded.

As a nation that wishes to move forward with the Holy Spirit, how does the start of the sermon on the mount speak into our actions? Do we strive to live up to the pattern we read about in the gospel or do we do things that show we are ignorant of the gospel? Our individual actions affect our collective consciousness. Let us continue to strive to be filled, not by prosperity and financial gain, but by living out righteousness in all we do and never become desensitised to the feelings of trauma and hurt that we find in other citizens, but like Jesus, seek to allow the actions of the "one" to have a godly impact on the "many".
