

UNCOVERING the COVER-UPS

We know from recent history of the Church's secrecy and avoidance of open process. But the Church is not the only institution to need scrutiny, as shown by the current Royal Commission into Banking. Government also should not be immune from scrutiny, as here too there is the temptation to conceal. The case for a national anti-corruption commission with real powers seems overwhelming. Meanwhile, the Government has proposed national security legislation that would criminalise much journalism that is now legal and vital, and thereby make it much harder to expose abuses.

Former Supreme Court Judge **David Harper AM**, a member of the National Integrity Committee, and award-winning journalist and academic **Margaret Simons** join Melbourne Archbishop **Philip Freier** to discuss these vital issues.



wine.' But Peter, standing with the eleven, raised his voice and addressed them, 'Men of Judea and all who live in Jerusalem, let this be known to you, and listen to what I say. Indeed, these are not drunk, as you suppose, for it is only nine o'clock in the morning. No, this is what was spoken through the prophet Joel: "In the last days it will be, God declares, that I will pour out my Spirit upon all flesh, and your sons and your daughters shall prophesy, and your young men shall see visions, and your old men shall dream dreams. Even upon my slaves, both men and women, in those days I will pour out my Spirit; and they shall prophesy. And I will show portents in the heaven above and signs on the earth below, blood, and fire, and smoky mist. The sun shall be turned to darkness and the moon to blood, before the coming of the Lord's great and glorious day. Then everyone who calls on the name of the Lord shall be saved."

Psalm 104. 26-36;

26 Lord, how various are your works;

in wisdom you have made them all, and the earth is full of your creatures.

27 There is the wide, immeasurable sea;

there move living things without number, great and small.

28 There go the ships, to and fro;

and there is that Leviathan, whom you formed to sport in the deep.

29 These all look to you;

to give them their food in due season.

30 When you give it to them, they gather it;

when you open your hand they are satisfied with good things.

31 When you hide your face, they are troubled;

Romans 8. 22-27;

We know that the whole creation has been groaning in labour pains until now; and not only the creation, but we ourselves, who have the first fruits of the Spirit, groan inwardly while we wait for adoption, the redemption of our bodies. For in hope we were saved. Now hope that is seen is not

hope. For who hopes for what is seen? But if we hope for what we do not see, we wait for it with patience. Likewise the Spirit helps us in our weakness; for we do not know how to pray as we ought, but that very Spirit intercedes with sighs too deep for words. And God, who searches the heart, knows what is the mind of the Spirit, because the Spirit intercedes for the saints according to the will of God.

GOSPEL John 15.26–27, 16.4b–15

Jesus spoke to his disciples: 'When the Advocate comes, whom I will send to you from the Father, the Spirit of truth who comes from the Father, he will testify on my behalf. You also are to testify because you have been with me from the beginning. I have said these things to you so that when their hour comes you may remember that I told you about them. I did not say these things to you from the beginning, because I was with you. But now I am going to him who sent me: vet none of you asks me. "Where are you going?" But because I have said these things to you, sorrow has filled your hearts. Nevertheless I tell you the truth: it is to your advantage that I go away, for if I do not go away, the Advocate will not come to you; but if I go, I will send him to you. And when he comes, he will prove the world wrong about sin and righteousness and judgement: about sin, because they do not believe in me; about righteousness, because I am going to the Father and you will see me no longer; about judgement, because the ruler of this world has been condemned. I still have many things to say to you, but you cannot bear them now. When the Spirit of truth comes, he will guide you into all the truth; for he will not speak on his own, but will speak whatever he hears, and he will declare to you the things that are to come. He will glorify me, because he will take what is mine and declare it to you. All that the Father has is mine. For this reason I said that he will take what is mine and declare it to you.'

+ + + + + + + PENTECOST SUNDAY

20th. May 2018

In the readings for this week, we experience moments of re-creation when God's Spirit is present in new and often surprising ways, bringing life. In fact, we can say along with John 6:63 that the Spirit gives life and that wherever the Spirit is present, life always bursts forth. It is this new and abundant life that we seek this week.

Focus scripture

Two important things for the future of the new church stand out in **Acts 2:1–21**. The first can easily be overlooked in this dramatic story: the followers of Jesus were all together. Presumably "all" means the 120 or so men-tioned in Acts 1:15. Why was this group all together? We know enough of the actions of Jesus to know that he attracted people from across the social, racial, and gender divides. The new community had probably only one thing in common – they all had an experience of Jesus. The second thing of great importance

to the future of the church is that everyone in the crowd heard about "God's deeds of power" (v.11) in their own language. No one had to change languages or cultures to hear the good news, no one had to become a different person to experience the presence of Christ. The Spirit of God, working in and through the believers came to people where they were in the language of home and heart.

In Acts, the believers speak in the power of the Spirit. In the Hebrew story of creation, the Spirit of God or a wind from God sweeps over the face of the waters and God speaks creation into being. In Acts, "a sound like the rush of a violent wind" gives the believers the power to speak a new, inclusive church into being.

The poet of **Psalm 104:24–34, 35b** does not subscribe to the giant clockmaker theory of God – a God who winds the world up, and lets it run without further involvement. Instead, God is intimately and continually engaged with creation. The life and death of every creature and the rhythms of nature are all things to which God is continually attentive.

In Romans 8:22–27, the language of God and the language of creation go much deeper than words can express. All of creation experiences the broken relationship between human beings and each other, between God and creation. The re-creations in Ezekiel and Acts are signposts to a great and universal re-creation, the hope for which sustains all those who wait in faith.

In **John 15:26–27; 16:4b–15** Jesus encourages his disciples four times with the news that the Advocate/the Spirit will come to be with them. The Spirit will be a teacher to them and tell them the truth. The truth about sin is that it is a deeper malaise than simply the individual actions or inactions of a person (see John 9). The truth about righteousness is that it is a deeper thing than doing the right thing; it comes from the heart that is in tune with God's purposes (see John 1:24, 7:24, and 8:16). The truth about judgment is the good news that Jesus does not judge the world but saves it (see John 12:47).

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Jesus promises an advocate that will speak the truth, and the Spirit of God flows out upon the early church, empowering Peter to make a bold sermon. Clearly God's truth is not to be hidden or kept down, but shared and spread throughout the world. Even in times when it seems difficult and pointless, we are always reminded that the power of God's spirit is ultimately greater than the powers of the world. Where do you experience God's spirit in your life? Where is God calling you to proclaim the spirit of truth?

REFLECTION

God, we thank you that you did not wind up the world like a clockwork machine and leave it to wind down.

We thank you that you are present with us continuing to create and renew life and that our lives truly are a gift from you. Amen.
