1 Corinthians 15, 12-20:

If Christ is proclaimed as raised from the dead, how can some of you say there is no resurrection of the dead? If there is no resurrection of the dead, then Christ has not been raised; and if Christ has not been raised, then our proclamation has been in vain and your faith has been in vain. We are even found to be misrepresenting God, because we testified of God that he raised Christ – whom he did not raise if it is true that the dead are not raised. For if the dead are not raised, then Christ has not been raised. If Christ has not been raised, your faith is futile and you are still in your sins. Then those also who have died in Christ have perished. If for this life only we have hoped in Christ, we are of all people most to be pitied. But in fact Christ has been raised from the dead, the first fruits of those who have died.

GOSPEL Luke 6, 17-26;

He came down with them and stood on a level place, with a great crowd of his disciples and a great multitude of people from all Judea, Jerusalem, and the coast of Tyre and Sidon. They had come to hear him and to be healed of their diseases; and those who were troubled with unclean spirits were cured. And all in the crowd were trying to touch him, for power came out from him and healed all of them. Then he looked up at his disciples and said -

'Blessed are you who are poor, for yours is the kingdom of God.

Blessed are you who are hungry now, for you will be filled.

Blessed are you who weep now, for you will laugh.

Blessed are you when people hate you, and when they exclude you, revile you, and defame you on account of the Son of Man.

Rejoice on that day and leap for joy, for surely your reward is great in heaven; for that is what their ancestors did to the prophets.

But woe to you who are rich, for you have received your consolation.

Woe to you who are full now, for you will be hungry. Woe to you who are laughing now, for you will mourn and weep.

Woe to you when all speak well of you, for that is what their ancestors did to the false prophets.'



SIXTH SUNDAY AFTER EPIPHANY

17th. February 2019

Jeremiah 17. 5-10; Jeremiah speaks the Lord's words about who is cursed and who is blessed. The nature images of a barren bush and a tree rooted near water describe the two types of people. The bush bears no fruit, and the tree is eternally green, even during times of drought. Where one's heart resides makes the difference. May our heart be in the Lord and our strength be in him.

Psalm 1; The psalm includes the imagery of the tree planted beside running water as found in the passage from Jeremiah and contrasts the yield of this tree with the wicked, whom the wind blows away like chaff. The psalmist's words encourage us to follow the law of the Lord rather than take counsel with the wicked. Why? Because the blessed are those who place their hope in the Lord.

This second reading comes from the climactic chapter of **1 Corinthians 15**, in which Paul responds to those who do not believe in the resurrection of the dead. With a teacher-like conditional statement Paul simply states that if there is no resurrection of the dead, then Christ himself has not been raised. If Christ has not been raised, then the dead have perished. May we place our hope in Christ, whose Resurrection is the hope of our own resurrection. **Luke 6. 17-26**; today we begin to proclaim the Gospel reading from Jesus' Sermon on the Plain. Both Jesus' disciples and a large crowd gather to hear him teach, but in Luke it seems that Jesus directs the Beatitudes most immediately toward his disciples, raising his eye toward them before he begins stating blessings and woes. Today he teaches us the Beatitudes, and we have the opportunity to hear them anew, connecting them to our earthly life of discipleship.

REFLECTION

Loving Lord Jesus Christ, source of all healing, may we feel your power to heal both body and spirit.

When our hope and faith are broken, make them whole and draw us closer to you.

Give us the grace to see your love in those who do not know you as you are and to help them understand that all love and life rest in you. Amen.
